- Smooth transition period Students who arrive at school with time to spare have the opportunity to settle into the classroom, prepare their materials and focus their minds on the lessons to come.
- Important information a typical school day starts with announcements and introductions to new lessons and concepts. Students who show up late may miss out on important details and be unprepared for future class events or key learning concepts.
- Develops long-term positive habits when students show up on time to school every day, they develop the habit of being punctual with important commitments.

BISM Intenships

The British International School of Madinaty (BISM) has initiated another internship round, to high school students, aimed at providing real-world experience across various fields.

This program was held in collaboration with esteemed organizations such as SIAC Construction, Cosmic city Engineering, the Egyptian Ministry of Health, Photopia, Kempinski Hotel, and Unipal. Twenty two students were exposed to the fields of engineering, medicine, creative industry, business management, hospitality management, podcasting, and Human Resources.

The internship program was designed to expose high school students to diverse career paths, fostering a deeper understanding of their interests and future career goals.

Although it only lasted one week during the summer break, it fulfilled all our objectives;

- 1. Experiential Learning: Students gained hands-on experience in different fields
- 2. Skill Development: developed practical skills and talents relevant to each field, enhancing the students' capabilities.
- 3. Career Exploration: exploring potential career paths, helping them make informed decisions about their future careers.
